HISTORIC BROADCAST RAISES OVER \$207,000 FOR DERECHO RELIEF

KCRG, KGAN and KWWL Team Up for <u>Eastern Iowa United</u>, a Fundraising Campaign For The United Way's Derecho Storm Assistance and Donations Fund



(CEDAR RAPIDS, IA) – Thursday night, August 27th, Cedar-Rapids-based broadcast TV stations KCRG and KGAN and Waterloo-based KWWL rallied for eastern Iowans hard-hit by the Aug 10th derecho storm.

Pulling together for a massive, live, local fundraising effort, the three stations worked cooperatively for over a week to bring "Eastern lowa United" to life. They coordinated a day-long community fundraiser that helped United Way chapters dealing directly with the damage and recovery efforts related to the storms of August 10th that left massive swaths of crops destroyed and every city in its path reeling with major damage rivaling that of a major hurricane. KWWL Station Manager John Huff sums up the effort that highlights the classic lowa ethos of *helping your neighbor in times of need*.

"Even though we are competitors, there was never one bit of disagreement or push back when planning this event. It felt like we were all ONE TV station working for the common good of those in need."

KCRG's VP and General Manager, Thom Pritz, was happy to fully back this initiative, stressing the focus remained on those suffering in our broadcast area.

"Knowing we raised \$207,000 to help so many in need today and for a long time to come, is why Local TV is so vital." Pritz continued. "I'm also so very proud of KCRG's parent company, Gray Television, who stepped up with an impressive \$25,000 donation to Eastern Iowa United and The Greater Cedar Rapids Community Foundation. "

As part of the donation Gray Television's Chairman and CEO Hilton Howell Jr stated:

"On August 10th we watched in horror as the unprecedented derecho tore through Eastern Iowa and much of the Midwest. The storm, equal to a strong Category 3 hurricane, ripped through the community destroying homes, crops and businesses. With our donations today, we stand with our Gray family members and the entire Eastern Iowa community as you work to rebuild your lives."

Highlighting the relationship formed between local TV broadcasters and viewers, KGAN General Manager, Glen Callanan, noted the power of working together creates an avenue for everyone to get involved and keeps eastern lowa moving forward in its recovery.

"Thanks to all who contributed to this historic fundraising television event and even more thanks to our viewers and citizens who went into their pockets to help their neighbors. As Broadcasters we were proud to team together to help as much as we could with our community that has taken such a blow."

All funds raised will be distributed to the United Way of East Central Iowa, United Way of Johnson and Washington Counties, and the Cedar Valley United Way.
